

Newborn Hearing Screens

Have you had your newborn screened for hearing loss? Erin Curtiss is a licensed midwife in Seattle who works on contract with the Washington State Department of Health to provide hearing screens for babies who are born at home or in a birth center. Ideally, babies should be screened by 3 months of age.

When: *The 3rd Wednesday of every month from 10:00-12:00.*

There is no need to make an appointment. Hearing screens are performed on a drop-in basis only. Typically, a hearing screen takes about 3 minutes, but sometimes it can take up to 15 minutes.

Payment: Your insurance will be billed. If you wish to pay out of pocket or if you do not have insurance, then an affordable cash pay option is available to you.

Exceptions: Newborn Hearing Screening will be cancelled if the screening day falls on a holiday, whenever the public schools are closed for inclement weather, or when the midwife who performs the screens is at a delivery. If you arrive for a hearing screen and find that it has been cancelled, please return the following month.
